COURSE DESCRIPTION: O. Henry Middle School Choir is open to all students who are interested in singing and performing. Four basic strands- preconception, creative expression/performance, historical and cultural heritage, and critical evaluation- provide broad, unifying structures for organizing the knowledge and skills of choir students. During the year, the choir members will be exposed to a variety of music styles from Pop, Rock, Jazz, and Classical, and students will gain skill in sight singing, proper vocal technique, and music theory. Term marks are based on singing samples, class work, and concert performances.

Students will perform at concerts, school functions, and community events. Performances are co-curricular and participation is required. Students will compete for awards during the school year and must maintain a grade point average of $70 \%$ in every class to remain eligible for competition.

## COURSE/TEKS OBJECTIVES:

1. The student describes and analyzes musical sound and demonstrates musical artistry.
2. The student sings individually and in groups, performing a varied repertoire of music.
3. The student reads and writes music notation.
4. The student creates and arranges music within specified guidelines.
5. The student relates music to history, to society, and to culture.
6. The student responds to and evaluates music and musical performances.

GRADING POLICY: 20\%= Performance Tests (concerts or class performances)
$80 \%=$ Daily Participation

MATERIALS NEEDED: Students will need and pen for each class period. Please send $\$ 30$ to cover Tshirt and solo ensemble contest entries.

PERFORMANCES: All choir members are expected to perform or contribute to the outcome of the performance. If a singer is ill or injured, a written note is required to be turned in before the performance if the individual is not able to perform. Students, who do not provide a note, must stay after school to do make-up work.

## CONCEPTS:

## Music Theory

The student will:

- draw staff notes, clefs, chords, key signatures, time signatures, measures and other symbols used in music notation
- analyze different forms of music

## Sight Reading

The student will:

- sing unrehearsed music using proper solfege and rhythm
- study the keys of F, C, and G
- perform rhythms that include whole, half, quarter, eighth, and sixteenth notes and rests


## Performing

The students will:

- sing in small and large ensembles for formal and informal audiences
- sing with healthy vocal tone, good vowel formation and proper posture
- perform a variety of repertoire in unison and harmony while displaying stage presence and performance etiquette


## Evaluation

The students will:

- critique themselves
- critique their choir
- critique other choirs
